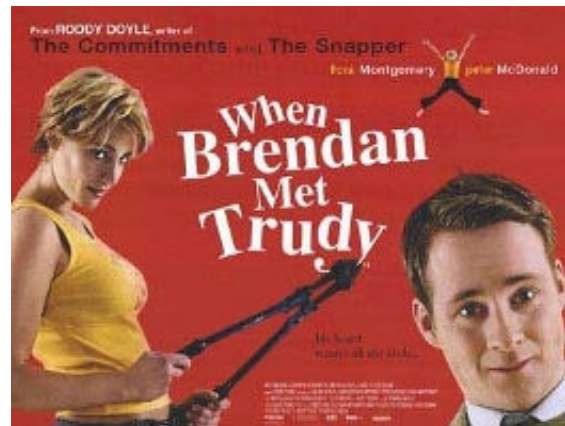


OUR NEXT PRESENTATION
